Sector Governance in Urban Sanitation

Goal (s)

The purpose of this course is to enhance the capacity of national and local decision-makers to provide efficient sanitation services by offering learning materials to understand different aspects of sanitation sector governance. The course includes three modules: a) Introduction; b) Economics, Pricing, and Financing of the Sanitation Sector; c) Institutional aspects. After presenting general definitions and concepts the main issues discussed in the two last modules include: what are the costs and their drivers? What are the sources of funding? What role could private sector play and how to contract it? What LG can do to improve sector governance?
